



Aplicación para el Fondo de Asistencia de Transporte

El Fondo de Asistencia de Transporte (“TAF” por sus siglas en inglés) provee asistencia financiera a los padres de familia o personas al cuidado de individuos con síndrome de Down, para que puedan recibir transporte conveniente a los programas y eventos de DSAGC o a las citas médicas y terapias de su ser querido con síndrome de Down.

DSAGC ofrece asistencia otorgando pases de Lyft Ride (o “créditos”). Los créditos se entregan en incrementos de \$50, y hasta dos créditos de \$50 por vez. Las familias elegibles pueden recibir hasta un máximo de \$300 en créditos cada año calendario. Para utilizar los créditos, los participantes deben poseer un teléfono inteligente y una cuenta en Lyft que deben abrir utilizando una tarjeta débito o crédito. Los pases se otorgan a través de un mensaje de texto incluyendo un enlace a la aplicación de Lyft Ride.

El fondo solo es elegible para familias de DSAGC que residen en los 12 condados de nuestra área de servicio. Para recibir esta asistencia, los participantes deben enviar el formato adjunto y la forma W-9.

Políticas del Fondo de Asistencia de Transporte (TAF)

- **Personas Elegibles:** Deben residir en la región metropolitana de Cincinnati, incluyendo los condados de Adams, Boone, Brown, Butler, Campbell, Clermont, Clinton, Dearborn, Hamilton, Highland, Kenton y Warren. Usted debe ser una madre/padre de familia o una persona al cuidado de un individuo con síndrome de Down.
- **No hay discriminación:** La elegibilidad no se determina con base en la raza, color de la piel, religión, orientación sexual, estado civil o necesidad económica.
- **Créditos para el transporte:** Los créditos para el transporte se proveen en incrementos de \$50, hasta dos de \$50 por cada solicitud. Créditos adicionales solo se pueden solicitar si los créditos previos han sido utilizados. Créditos que no han sido utilizados, expiran 90 días después de haber sido expedidos. El valor máximo de créditos autorizados por año calendario es de \$300.
- **Aplicación:** La solicitud se tarda 14 días en ser procesada.
- **Actividades elegibles:** Los créditos de Lyft pueden ser utilizados para eventos y programas de DSAGC, terapias o citas médicas de su ser querido con síndrome de Down.
- **Autorización:** Cada solicitud es revisada por DSAGC para determinar su elegibilidad.
- **Uso inapropiado de los fondos:** DSAGC confía en el uso apropiado que usted le dé a los créditos de Lyft para los propósitos especificados en la aplicación. Si DSAGC conoce su uso inapropiado, usted no va a poder recibir asistencia en el futuro.

Section references are to the Internal Revenue Code unless otherwise noted.

Purpose of Form

An individual or entity (Form W-9 requester) who is required to file an information return with the IRS must obtain your correct taxpayer identification number (TIN) which may be your social security number (SSN), individual taxpayer identification number (ITIN), adoption taxpayer identification number (ATIN), or employer identification number (EIN), to report on an information return the amount paid to you, or other amount reportable on an information return. Examples of information returns include, but are not limited to, the following.

- Form 1099-INT (interest earned or paid)
- Form 1099-DIV (dividends, including those from stocks or mutual funds)
- Form 1099-MISC (various types of income, prizes, awards, or gross proceeds)
- Form 1099-B (stock or mutual fund sales and certain other transactions by brokers)
- Form 1099-S (proceeds from real estate transactions)
- Form 1099-K (merchant card and third party network transactions)
- Form 1098 (home mortgage interest), 1098-E (student loan interest), 1098-T (tuition)
- Form 1099-C (canceled debt)
- Form 1099-A (acquisition or abandonment of secured property)

Use Form W-9 only if you are a U.S. person (including a resident alien), to provide your correct TIN.

If you do not return Form W-9 to the requester with a TIN, you might be subject to backup withholding. See What is backup withholding, later.
